**SUBJECT:** **9/1/12 Implementation Date - Energy Independence and Security Act of 2007**

– This bulletin serves as a reminder and follow up to our bulletin issued last month (MB-1201, 1/31/12) –

On September 1<sup>st</sup> of this year, ALL MANUFACTURERS of residential gas, oil and electric boilers (under 300,000 Btuh input) can no longer produce boilers with a constant burning pilot. The following items are also manufacturer requirements to be implemented per code:

- Meet minimum AFUE requirements
  - Gas/Water 82%, Gas/Steam 80%, Oil/Water 84%, Oil/Steam 82%
- Update boiler controls (To meet inferred heat load requirement)
  - The control will automatically adjust a delay in the operation of the burner based on the amount of residual heat available in the system. A greater calculated residual heat results in a greater delay.

Even though all boiler manufacturers must be in production with these changes by September 1, 2012, **distributors and contractors can continue to purchase and sell all types (including standing pilot models) beyond the 9/1/12 date - until supplies last.**

Weil-McLain residential boilers that are already in compliance:

WM97+, Ultra Series 3-UE, WGO, WTGO, SGO

Weil-McLain residential boilers that require minimal modification include:

CGa, CGi, CGs, CGt, GV90+, EG, PEG, PFG-5, Ultra Oil

We will continue to provide Weil-McLain product updates as we get closer towards implementation.
